Introduction

Welcome to our first annual report. Please take the time to read about our growth and share in our accomplishments.

Brief History

The founders of TENT were inspired by Atul Gawande's book *Being Mortal*, which describes how our society fails to support our elderly and the Virtual Village solution.

The first TENT planning meeting was held in July 2016. TENT became a member of the National Village-to-Village (VtV) Network in November 2016 and since has tapped into their many resources on a regular basis. After many more meetings, research, and discussion, the founders moved ahead to formally organize a New Mexico nonprofit corporation in June 2017 and received Federal 501(c)(3) tax status soon thereafter.

After more than a year of public programs and gathering Volunteers, we began offering services to Members in October 2018. Rapidly Members began to sign up, as did Volunteers. Marianne Furedi became our paid Volunteer Coordinator and brought her warm heart and nurse's sensitivities to Volunteer recruitment, orientation, and meetings. In our first 9 months, over 500 service requests have been filled, requiring over 800 hours of Volunteer effort.

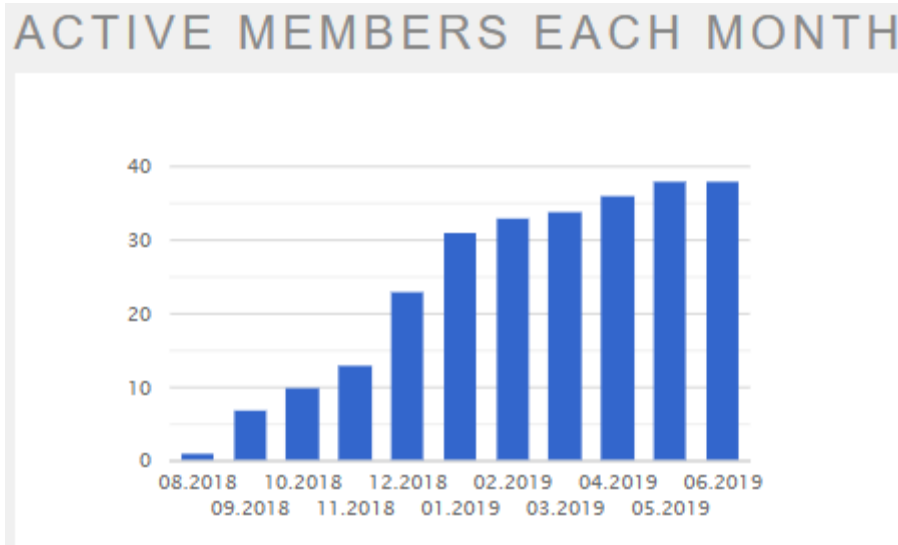

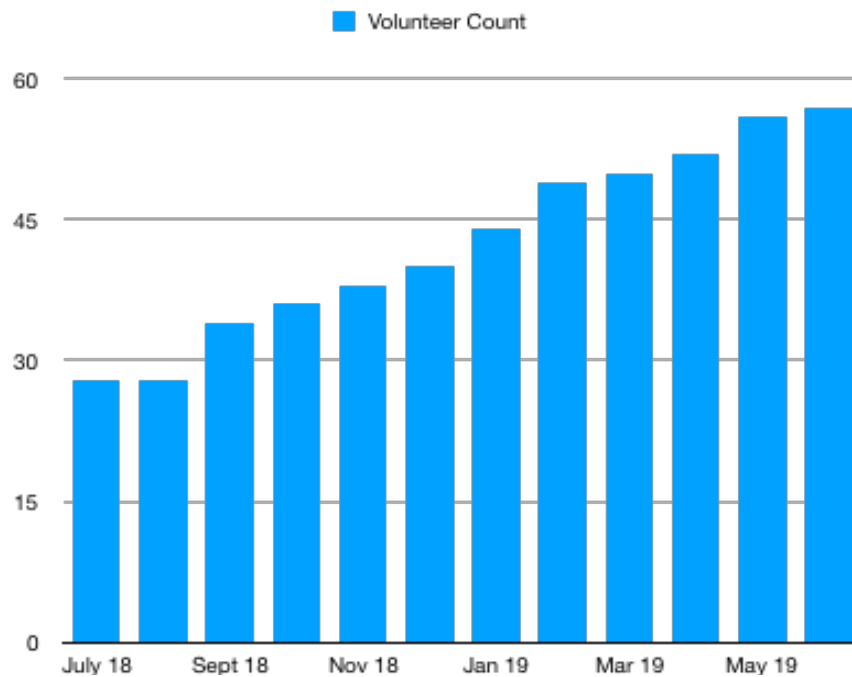
We currently have 38 TENT Members

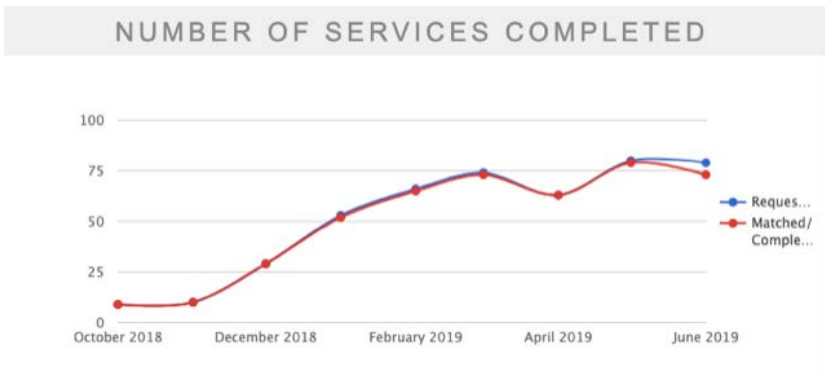

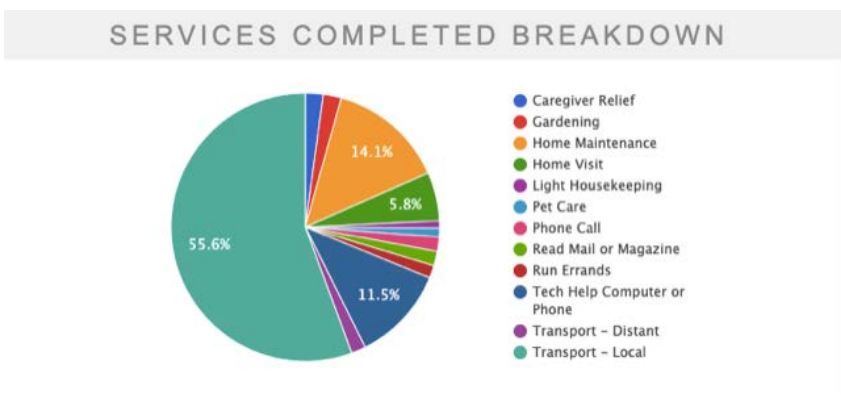
